- A Morton Thomas & Associates (AMT) has completed the traffic count and data collection. A preliminary report has been issued to Todd and John Lloyd which is being reviewed now. A presentation to the PSC is currently planned for the March meeting.

REVIEW OF CURRENT PERMIT PARKING SYSTEM

- The Council has requested that the PSC look at the current permit parking system in the Town and to make a recommendation(s) on ways to improve what is currently in place. Sue (Hill) thinks that the PSC might consider other parking options (eg zoned parking) and take more of a pro-active role. We'll spend some time discussing this
- A discussion of Town-wide permit parking is on the table. Sue Hill, Abby Marshall and Chris Wright have volunteered to explore options for a Town wide permit parking plan. It may take some time to develop this but at least it is a start. All we are currently doing is pushing non-resident parking further and further into the center of the Town
- Enforcement of permit parking continues to be a major concern of the PSC
- Impact of Town wide permit parking – cost of signage, issuing permits by Town staff, visitor passes to all residents, etc.
- Other ideas are welcome
